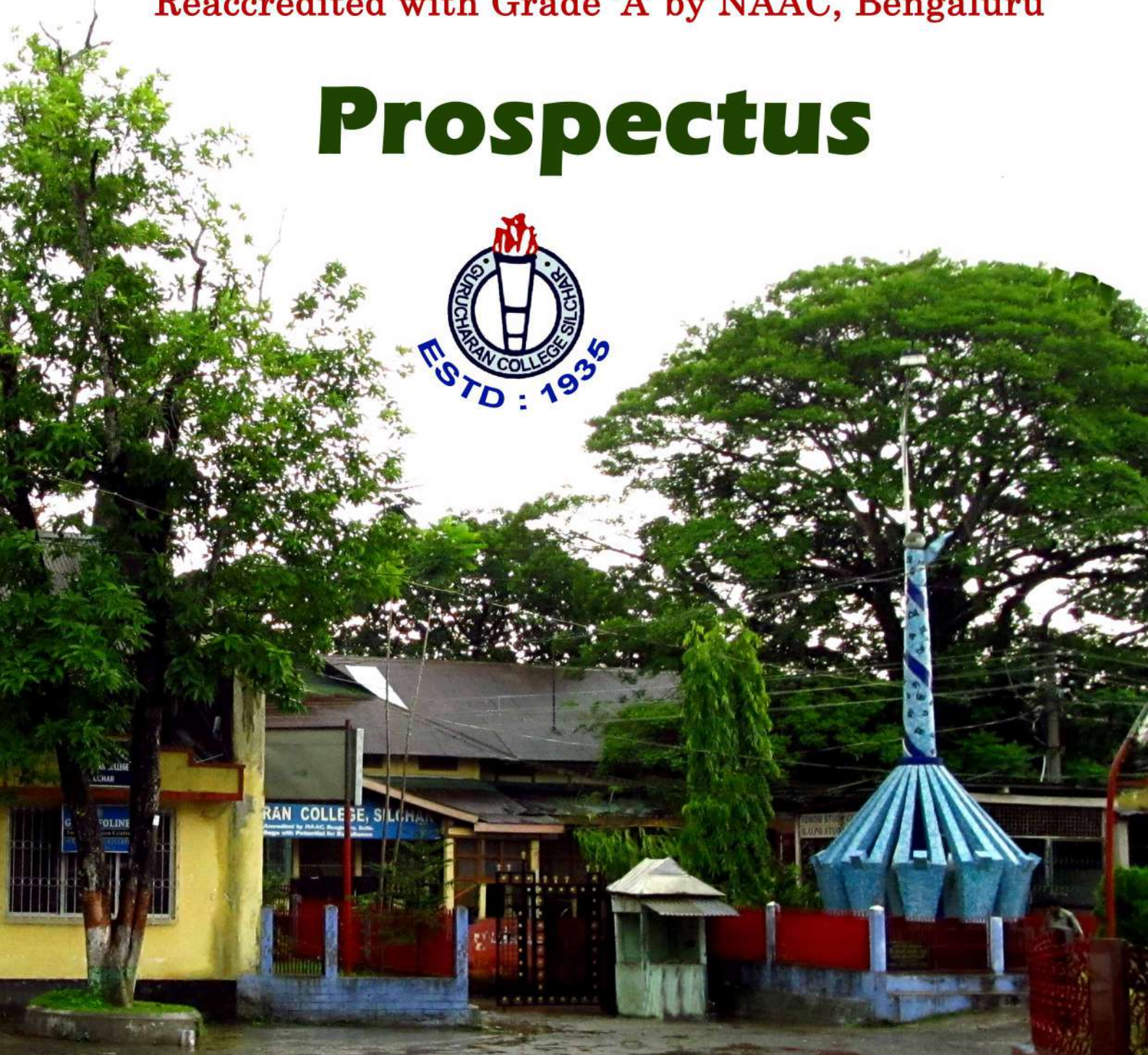

Now, the college is enmeshed in every sphere of life, and is renowned as a citadel of Higher education in North East India. The college has attracted gifted and talented

students and from all the 7 sister states from its beginning and still continues to do so. History of Gurucharan College, Silchar

Gurucharan College, established on 15th July 1935, is recognised as one of the premier institutions in the field of Collegiate education. It has carved out a distinct identity of its own in the field of higher education in the eastern part of India. The well-acclaimed reputation of the college stands not on its vast area of land, buildings constructed on it or on its enrolment strength but on its enriched academic and intellectual legacy built up during the time-span of 83 years of its life at the cost of effort and sacrifices of a batch of dedicated personalities who left no stone unturned to erect this huge edifice of higher education in this Barak Valley. Today, this institution of potential excellence is proud to have a large number of alumni who have established themselves in different professions and vocations of life in India and abroad.

Initially, the college was housed in a Bungalow of one Late Promode Chandra Datta at Rongpur on the bank of the river Barak. When the river bank erosion began to swallow the college premises, it was shifted temporarily to the campus of Silchar Normal School. At that time, classes were held in the Morning shift. However, this temporary phase of crisis of accommodation was soon over. Gurucharan College began to receive generous help and assistance from different quarters and ultimately it was able to acquire permanent space in its present state of location.

In fact, Gurucharan College came into being on account of the far-sighted vision of **Late Bishnu Charan Dey Purkayastha** of the Department of Education, Assam. To give a shape to his vision of establishing a college here at Silchar, he got the support of **Late Kiron Sashi Nag**, the widow of **Late Guru Charan Nag**, who came forward with a generous donation of Rs.10,000, in 1934 for the establishment of the college. The college acquired its name after Kiron Sashi Nag's husband Gurucharan and special emphasis was put on women education. This college was fortunate enough to have **Arun Kumar Chanda**, Bar-at-law and the son of **Late Kamini Kumar Chanda** as the founder Principal. Initially, the college had been affiliated to the Calcutta University. In 1949, the college was affiliated to the Gauhati University. With the establishment of the Assam University (Central) at Silchar, in 1994 Gurucharan College is now affiliated to the Assam University. Today, the college boasts of having a student enrolment of more than 4000 in Arts, Science, Commerce stream including BBA and Higher Secondary.

The course curricula and examinations of H.S Course are conducted as per rules and regulations of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. On the other the three year Degree courses, with Semester system, are conducted as per the syllabi and examination rules framed by the Assam University, Silchar.

Besides these, from the academic session 2005-06, the college has come up with three UGC approved Career Oriented Programmes (value-added course) for the students conducted by the Department of Commerce. The introduction of different self-financing courses in the subject like Biotechnology, Computer Science (Pass and Honours), Diploma course in Bio-informatics, Computer Application (DCA), Library and Information Science, Bengali Recitation, Spoken Sanskrit and Manipuri Folk Dance are added chapters to the glorious history of the College. The BBA Course is yet another added feather to the crown of the college. The newly introduced Mass Communication as elective subject in UG level has opened a new area of learning for the students of the college. Over and above, the college has housed IGNOU as a Centre of distance education facilitating both UG and PG Courses.

The year 2016 is a glorious year in the history of Gurucharan College for being reaccredited as 'A' Grade with CGPA 3.11 under cycle 2 by NAAC, Bangalore. It has also been recognised as college with potential Excellence (CPE) by UGC. It is to be put on records that the college also possesses well-equipped library with its large variety of books, journals and magazines, e-journals and INFLIBNET facility. The library also has collaboration with the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India to assist in developing the Manuscript Resource Centre and National Manuscript Conservation in the library.

Gurucharan College also owns a sophisticated Central Computer lab, a magnificent auditorium, enriched Anthropological Museum, Bioinformatics Centre, Biotech Hub, two well-built hostels separately for boys and girls, and well-developed playground, two Units of NSS, NCC wings for boys and girls and so on. It has also made available well equipped gymnasium separately for boys and girls, health centre, cafeteria, separate common room for boys and girls and a printing press of its own. Keeping in mind the directives of the government, the college has taken initiative for cashless transaction. It is also one of the proud members of Digital India Campaign.

GENERAL INFORMATION

A. ADMISSION FOR H.S & TDC CLASSES

- i. Application for admission into the college should be made in prescribed Application Form through online mode only.
- ii. Notices prescribing the norms, date of interview and admission etc. are hung up in the College Notice Board generally within a week of publication of the results of the qualifying examinations.
- iii. Admission process is conducted under direct control of Admission Committee constituted for the purpose. There is separate admission committee for each faculty / stream (Arts, Science & Commerce), headed by a Convener. Each committee will determine their respective admission criteria.
- iv. The candidates have to submit separate admission forms for separate faculties.
- v. While filling up the forms for admission an applicant should pay due attention in the matter of furnishing his/her preference for Combination he/she intends to take up.
- vi. Admission is based strictly on merit and is governed by College admission rules framed by admission committees. Convener's decision regarding admission stands final.
- vii. Any undue pressure or interference in the matter(s) of admission will be treated as disqualification amounting to forfeiture of claim for admission.
- viii. The attested copies of the following documents are to be furnished along with application for admission:
 - 1 Supporting documents to prove domicile of Assam.
 - 1 Mark Sheet and Certificates of H.S.L.C. and other qualifying examinations.
 - 1 Character Certificate.
 - 1 SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Certificate.
 - 1 Gap certificate in case the student passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year.
 - 1 Migration certificate for C.B.S.E. and outside State students.
 - 1 Latest Passport size photograph for Identity card.
- ix. No request for admission will be entertained after the prescribed date fixed by the authority.

B. SOME IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS :

- i. Submission of Registration form for H.S. & Degree (TDC) students is compulsory.
- ii. Students are directed to go through the Notice Board / College Website regularly to acquire necessary information from time to time.
- iii. Guardians are requested to keep checking the local news paper and college website for Eligibility criteria, date of admission in Higher secondary & Degree (TDC) Courses.

C. CHANGE OF SUBJECT(S) / COMBINATION

In general, change of subject(s)/ combination is not encouraged. Students should give proper thought in the matter before filling in their application form for admission.

D. COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

Application for Transfer Certificate shall be accompanied by the following requisites:

- i) Dues clearance certificate from the College Office.
- ii) Library Clearance Certificate.
- iii) Hostel Clearance Certificate.
- iv) Records of attendance duly signed by the respective Heads of the Departments.
- v) Surrender of College Identity Card.

E. ADMISSION OF UNSUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

- i) H.S. 1st Year and 2nd Year students who appeared at the AHSE Council's examination but failed, shall appear at the subsequent First Year / Final Year Examination of the Council as non-collegiate candidates except that H.S. 2nd year Science students shall be required to attend requisite number of practical classes on getting themselves admitted as casual students.
- ii) In case of TDC Students, Guidelines of Assam University will be applicable.

F. COLLEGE EXAMINATION AND ATTENDANCE RULES

- i) Minimum 2 (two) Unit Tests will be held in Degree (TDC) & H.S. Level. Weightage will be given to examination results of Unit Tests in sending up students for Council/University Examination.
- ii) A minimum of 75% of class attendance is mandatory to appear in the Council/University examination, as a regular candidate.

G. GENERAL RULES FOR DISCIPLINE

- i. The college maintains a high standard of discipline. Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students. They are to obey traditional norms of discipline.
- ii. Students and guardians are required to furnish an undertaking at the time of admission in respect of the students' regular attendance in classes and appearance in college examinations.
- iii. The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college and hostel fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means in the examination etc. are some of the offences which may make the erring students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, non-award of college certificate, forced transfer, expulsion from the College and Hostel.
- iv. Students are to keep Photo-Identity Cards with them in the College campus. On demand, students are required to produce Photo-Identity Cards issued to them by the college authority. Failure to produce the Identity Cards may debar them from attending Classes/ College.
- v. Students may be suspended / expelled / device seized or refused admission to next session for any breach of College or hostel discipline, such as
 - Ä Use of alcoholic beverages and hallucinatory drugs.
 - Ä Political or communal involvement which affect the peace and harmony in the College Campus.
- v. Use of Mobile Phone & Cell phone, ipods, MP3 players by the students within the College Campus is strictly prohibited.
- vi. Parking place should be used for parking of two-wheelers, cycles, cars etc.
- vii. While within the College Campus, students should be in college uniform with college emblem.
- viii. All forms of ragging in hostel and college-campus are strictly prohibited and will make a student liable to punitive/disciplinary action.
- ix. The courses of studies in G. C. College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time courses/job anywhere simultaneously.
- x. Students' Society and Associations shall be subjected to such rules and regulations that college administration may describe from time to time.
- xi. Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the College and Hostel premises shall require the approval of the College Authority.
- xii. All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the Institution and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURES

TWO - YEAR HIGHER SECONDARY (H.S.) COURSE :

Two - Year Higher Secondary (H.S.) Course in Arts, Science & Commerce is governed by the rules and regulations of Higher Secondary Council, Assam. The course comprises of two examinations viz. (i) First Year and (ii) Final Year. Promotion to second year or final year depends on the successful completion of first year examination conducted by the College under AHSEC guidelines.

Eligibility for Admission to First Year H.S. Course :

For seeking admission to the first year Higher Secondary Course, a candidate must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination of SEBA, Guwahati or Secondary Examination of CBSE or Other Board Examination recognised by the AHSEC.

Admission in H.S. course of any stream will be given as per the specified percentage of marks prescribed by the respective Admission Committee.

Note : In case of Gap year, 2% marks per year will be deducted from the original percentage obtained by a candidate in HSLC.

Number of Seats in First Year of H.S. Course :

The total number of seats earmarked for the session 2019-2020 in different streams are as follows :

(i) Arts	:	Morning = 120	Day = 200
(ii) Science	:	Morning = 50	Day = 100
(iii) Commerce	:	Morning = 80	Day = 120

Reservation :

- There is provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to ST, SC etc. as per Govt. Rules.
- A few seats are reserved for Children of G.C. College Employees.

Unit Tests (compulsory) will be held within:

- 1st test September/October &
- 2nd test January/February

Each test of 25 marks, qualifying marks is 30%. If any candidate fails to appear in the tests or obtain qualifying marks then only one special test may be arranged before the submission of application forms and fees for the examination.

Eligibility criteria for admission in examination:

- i) One should have 75% of attendance both in the theory and practical papers. 65% attendance may be considered only on special ground as justified and certified by the Principal.
- ii) One should have to qualify in the unit tests securing at least 30% of marks.

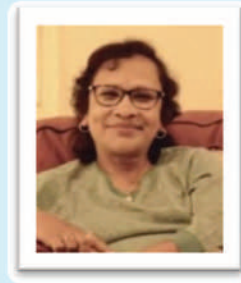

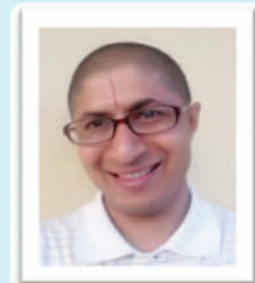

INSTRUCTIONS FOR TDC (CBCS) STUDENTS

1. **Additional GE Course (AGE):** A student may take one more Generic Elective Course as an "Additional Generic Elective Course" (AGE). This additional course shall be treated as GE Course in all respects but performance under such additional course shall NOT be considered for calculation of SGPA/ CGPA/ Award of Degree. The purpose of this category of course is to provide students a wider option to supplement their studies of a Core Course. There shall be equal weightage of CCA for the "Additional GE Course" (AGE).
2. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** AEC are of two kinds:
 1. **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** are the compulsory courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines
 2. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs)** are the compulsory value-based and/or skill-based aimed at providing hands-on-training, skills, etc. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.
3. **Maximum duration for the completion of a TDC (CBCS) programme of study** is 5 (five) years at a stretch from the date of admission (i.e., 10 (ten) consecutive End Semester Examinations) as per the "Guidelines on Determination of a Uniform Span Period within which a Student may be allowed to Qualify for a Degree" published by UGC dated October 15, 2015. This criterion shall be strictly adhered to while determining the eligibility to appear in any ESE for Arrear Paper/s, and Betterment Examination.
4. In case of selection of eligible candidates for admission to any TDC (CBCS) programme of study, the colleges shall follow the Statutory Reservation Policy of the Government including the Rules and Regulations prescribed therein.
5. A learner shall get admission in the First Semester of TDC (CBCS) taught in a college and admission to First Semester of TDC (CBCS) shall be governed by the admission criteria and, the Rules and Regulations mentioned in the prospectus published by the college.
6. A candidate shall register himself/ herself with Assam University during his/ her admission to First Semester as a registered student of the University through the prescribed Application Form and by paying requisite amount of Registration Fee.
7. Previously registered students of other Board/ Council/ Higher Educational Institution/ University shall have to submit Original Copy of Migration Certificate while applying for registration under Assam University, Silchar except for those students who have passed the last examination from Assam Higher Secondary Educational Council, Guwahati, Assam.
8. **Different components and distribution of marks for Continuous and Comprehensive Assessment (CCA)**
 - I. Full Marks & Pass Marks for CCA (Unit Test + Attendance)**

Courses with only Theory paper:
Full Marks = (Unit Test: 20 + Attendance: 10) = 30 (thirty);
Pass Marks = 12 (twelve)

Courses with both Theory & Practical papers:
Full Marks = (Unit Test: 14 + Attendance: 06) = 20 (twenty);
Pass Marks = 08 (eight)
 - II. UNIT TEST:**

Maximum marks:
Courses with only Theory paper = 20 (twenty);
Courses with both Theory & Practical papers = 14 (fourteen)
9. There shall be two Unit Tests per semester for each and every theory paper excluding Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and, dates of such tests shall be notified by the College Authority. The highest mark scored by a student out of two Unit Tests shall be awarded to the student as the marks under Unit Test of CCA.
10. There shall be NO Unit Test for practical paper.
11. A student who failed to secure minimum pass marks in CCA of a paper shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of the End Semester Examination (ESE). However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar semester (odd/even) as an Arrear Paper with the condition that:
 1. he/she will appear in the Unit Test/s of the concerned paper along with the regular students and to secure minimum pass marks;

2. he/ she will appear with such number of Arrear Papers in similar ESE(odd/even) as laid down under Rule 23 of Assam University Regulations (CBCS), 2018.
12. Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended Course Structure of the concerned programme of study.
13. Class Attendance shall be calculated based on actual number of classes held during each semester in each course/ paper. Number of decimal will be rounded off to next higher number (e.g., 74.01% be rounded off to 75%).
14. Only the students with 75% and above of attendance in any paper (excluding "Additional GE Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall be allowed to appear in the concerned paper in that End Semester Examination (ESE).
15. However, a student with less than 75% of attendance in any paper (excluding any paper of Additional GE Course, if any) of the concerned semester shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of that ESE but may be allowed to get admission in the immediate next higher semester. However, such a student may appear in the subsequent similar ESE (odd/even) in the concerned paper as an Arrear Paper and, marks to be awarded under CCA for each paper shall be the marks previously secured by the student in the concerned paper.

Note: Marks under CCA shall be carried forward as per above Rule only if the student secure pass mark in the Unit Test of the concerned paper else he/ she shall have to appear in Unit Test in the concerned paper along with the regular students in the concerned semester to secure minimum pass mark allotted for CCA of the concerned paper.

Eligibility for Admission

Candidates for Admission to the 1st (First) Semester of TDC (CBCS) shall be required to have passed the Higher Secondary (+2) or its equivalent Examinations conducted by any recognised University/ Board/ Council, which shall be treated as qualifying Examination.

No candidate shall be admitted to 1st (First) Semester of TDC (CBCS) Programme of study, unless he/she has passed the qualifying examination.

Merely possessing eligibility as referred to above will not entitle the right to admission.

Admission into TDC (CBCS) of any stream will be guided by the norms prescribed by the respective Admission Committee in which the percentage of marks secured in the qualifying examination will be of prime importance.

Note : In case of Gap Year, 2% marks per year will be deducted from the original percentage obtained by a candidate in the qualifying examination.

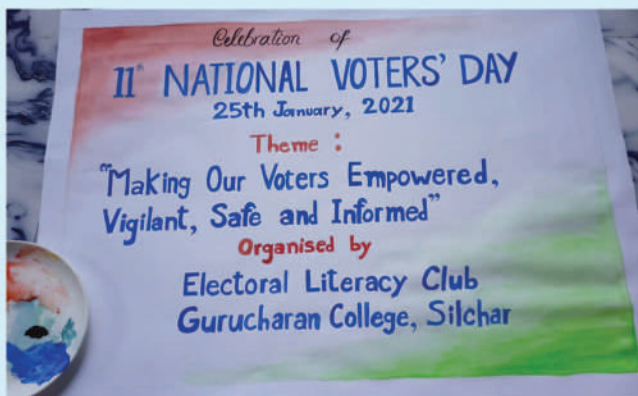

The Cell, through active liaison with various recruiting agencies and reputed HR personnel, conducts various placement drives and campus interviews through which a good number of students are able to find placement positions. It also provides support to the students in the development of soft skills to make them well-equipped to challenge the rigours of competitive tests. From time to time, the Cell organizes seminars and workshops to inform the students about the emerging professional trends and events, job profiles, leadership roles, entrepreneurship, market needs, etc.

The college has two NSS units comprising of 100 volunteers per unit. The motto of NSS is 'Not me but you'. The NSS units of the college are very vibrant in doing works in the social sectors and extend community service.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Gurucharan College, Silchar, was established on Oct, 2005. The primary goal of IQAC is to develop a quality system for conscious, consistent & catalytic programmed action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the college. The IQAC ensures continuous improvement in the entire operations of the institution and ensures the Institution's accountability to the stakeholders.

For enrichment of academic and extra-academic activities of the college, IQAC has established three centres namely GCC-Infoline, Eco Club and Central Instrumentation Centre (CIC). G.C. COLLEGE WOMEN'S CELL

For the protection of the women staff and female students against any kind of harassment in the working place, G.C. College has established a Women Cell. The motto of this Women's Cell is to offer all sorts of redressal of grievances of women - both teachers & students, in this co-educational institution, in addition to generating interest in women folks of this College for participation in different Social Welfare Schemes. All Women Teachers are the members of this Women's Cell. Two female students are also offered membership of this Women's Cell.

RED RIBBON CLUB

As a service to the nation Red Ribbon Club organises Blood donation Camp in the college. In September 2015, 265 donors (students, ex-students, NCC cadets, teachers and others) donated blood which is considered to be the highest by an educational institution in this region.

It also arranges special AIDS awareness programme through open-air drama in various places to enlighten the locality regarding the various precautionary measures to be taken for preventing AIDS.

EXTENSION SERVICE CELL

The Extension Service Cell runs a coaching centre in slum area. It provides study materials like copy, pencil, rubber, pencil box, umbrella, school bag to the students. Yoga classes are also carried out among the students.

In January, 2016 at the Itkhola ghat slum area a free eye camp was organised and 478 patients were examined and free medicines were provided. Free cataract operations to 20 patents identified in the camp were done through Ramakrishna Mission Sevashrama, Silchar. 60 patients were provided free spectacles after proper examination.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

To take care of all kinds of grievances of the students regarding academic and cocurricular activities the college has a Grievance Redressal Cell to address the same.

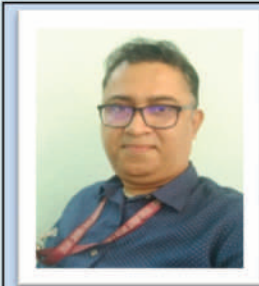
COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT CELL

SCHOLARSHIPS

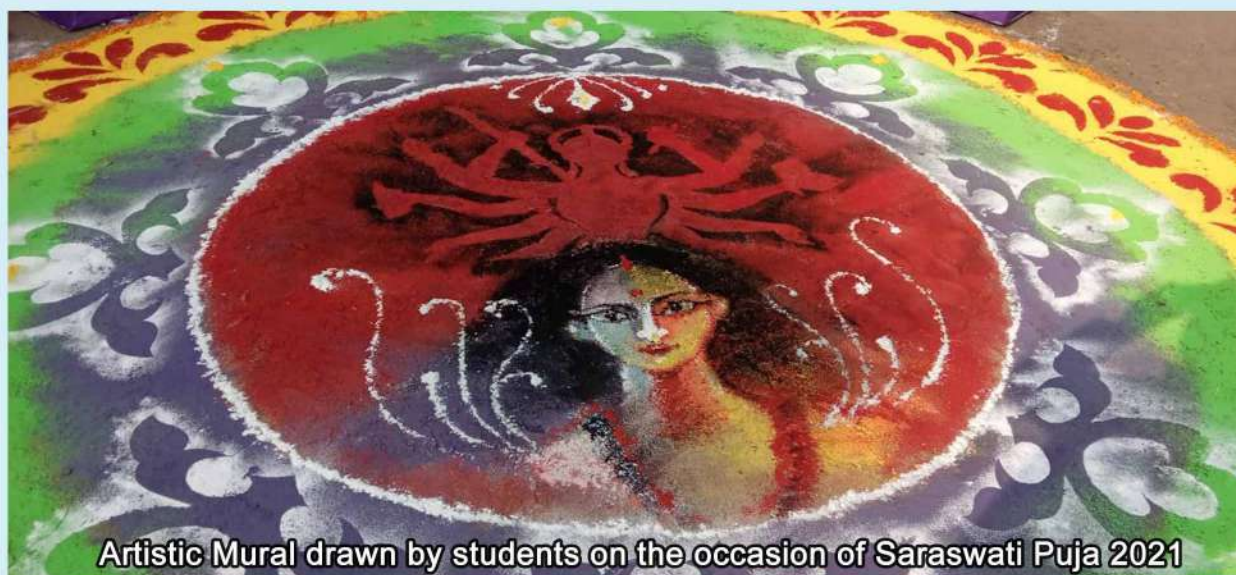

B. C. GUPTA MEMORIAL CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Gurucharan college Library was established in the year 1935 and started functioning in the very same year. The Library was named after late Baikuntha Chandra Gupta following a huge donation from his family for development of the library. The library celebrated the platinum-jubilee year along with the college. The glimpses of the library are the followings :

1. **Library Users :** Students: 4,722 ; Teachers: 88; Non-Teaching Staff: 34.
Also open to non institutional members like research scholars, academicians, Ex-teachers and locals.

2. **Library Staff :** 9 including Librarian (4 Sanctioned & 5 part-time staff)

3. **Library Hours :** 9 am to 5pm.

4. **Library System :** Open Access System where library users can browse books in the stack & issue

6. **Computerization :** Library having Local Area Network (LAN) with 16 computers with Server. Complete database of books is available through OPAC. Automation is completed with SOUL software provided by INFLIBNET Center, Ahmedabad.

7. **Library Sections :**

A) **Stack section :** Here, the main collection of the college in the form of Text Books is kept. The number of volumes is nearly 36,177 at present. Due to open access system, students and teachers are free to visit the stack area to select their own choice.

B) **Reference Section:** Here, the rare and valuable collection is kept as reference source. Nearly 4000 volumes of valuable books are there for use by various categories of users like renowned personalities, resource persons, research scholars and university and college students. Persons not only from various parts of Barak Valley visit this library, but also from various parts of Brahmaputra Valley, North East India, Kolkata, New Delhi, Bangalore, etc. come to visit this library in search of information.

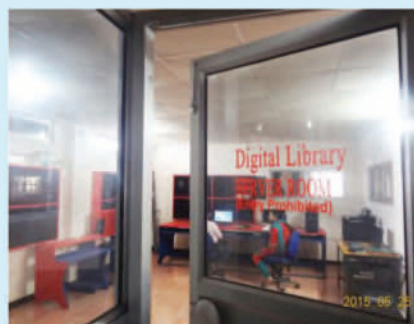

C) **Manuscript Section** : This is a new feather to the college library which was developed during 2004-05. In 1995, the Manuscript Section was designated as Manuscript Resource Centre (MRC) by the National Mission for Manuscript (Now under IGNCA), Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India. This MRC covers 12 districts of Assam for manuscripts survey, documentation and preservation. In 2010, a Manuscript Conservation Centre (MCC) was also established in collaboration with the same Ministry of which activities are already started.

D) **Periodical Section** : This section contains almost 36 periodicals ranging from research level, career opportunities and popular magazine.

E) **Newspaper Section**: This section houses 7 nos. of newspaper.

F) **Digital Library Section**: The Library is having a digital library with techfocuz digital Library Software.

G) **UGC-Network Resource Centre**: Under this centre, coordination of various activities, programmes, schemes, notices, etc, sponsored by UGC are looked after besides providing Internet services to teachers and students.

H) **EDUSAT National Network Centre**: The EDUSAT National Network Centre, which has been developed in collaboration with the Consortium of Educational Communication, New Delhi, is presently active in the College library, through which national educational programmes telecast by CEC, UGC, ISRO, IGNOU are available not only for viewing but one can also participate in the discussions live through phone or by web camera.

I) **UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium**: The College library has been selected for the UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium, a programme which is sponsored by the UGC under INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad. Though activities are pending yet, when it will get activated. library users will be able to browse and download approximately 4600 periodicals, national and international, in the library. The G.C. College library is amongst other 50 colleges of all over India to get selected for such programme.

J) **N-LIST Programme**: The College is now having the latest INFLIBNET Programme called National Library & information Service of Scholarly Content (N-LIST) through which more than 6000+ e-journals (including current issues with 5-10 years back files) and more than 31,35,000+ e-books are accessible for any user using login ID and Password. Students are allowed to use this facility from the Central Library.

k) **N.E. Block**: This Section is having Micro Literature of North - Eastern Regions.

PRINTING PRESS

The College has its own Printing Press with Offset printing, cutting, binding section along with infrastructure for DTP work. A number of Departmental magazines, Books with ISBN have already been published from this press.

Visiting hours : Tuesday and Friday from 12 noon to 2 pm and on call as and when necessary.

The G.C. College Canteen/Cafeteria is located in the main campus. It provides hygenic and wholesome food at subsidised rate with separate sitting area for the staffs and students of this College .

CENTRAL INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE

The Central Instrumentation Centre(CIC) has been setup in our college from the session 2011-12 with the objective to provide an easy access to all the faculty members and students for performing research/ project works. In the coming years, the scope of CIC will be extended further to provide the instruments having multi-disciplinary utilities to all the researchers. The coordinator of the centre is Mr Kumar Sunar, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Physics.
