History of Gurucharan College, Silchar

Gurucharan College, established on 15th July 1935, is recognised as one of the premier institutions in the field of Collegiate education. It has carved out a distinct identity of its own in the field of higher education in the eastern part of India. The well-acclaimed reputation of the college stands not on its vast area of land, buildings constructed on it or on its enrolment strength but on its enriched academic and intellectual legacy built up during the time-span of 88 years of its life at the cost of effort and sacrifices of a batch of dedicated personalities who left no stone unturned to erect this huge edifice of higher education in this Barak Valley. Today, this institution of potential excellence is proud to have a large number of alumni who have established themselves in different professions and vocations of life in India and abroad.

Initially, the college was housed in a Bungalow of one Late Promode Chandra Datta at Rongpur on the bank of the river Barak. When the river bank erosion began to swallow the college premises, it was shifted temporarily to the campus of Silchar Normal School. At that time, classes were held in the Morning shift. However, this temporary phase of crisis of accommodation was soon over. Gurucharan College began to receive generous help and assistance from different quarters and ultimately it was able to acquire permanent space in its present state of location.

In fact, Gurucharan College came into being on account of the far-sighted vision of **Late Bishnu Charan Dey Purkayastha** of the Department of Education, Assam. To give a shape to his vision of establishing a college here at Silchar, he got the support of **Late Kiron Sashi Nag**, the widow of **Late Guru Charan Nag**, who came forward with a generous donation of Rs.10,000, in 1934 for the establishment of the college. The college acquired its name after Kiron Sashi Nag's husband Gurucharan and special emphasis was put on female education. This college was fortunate enough to have **Arun Kumar Chanda**, Bar-at-law and the son of **Late Kamini Kumar Chanda** as the founder Principal. Initially, the college had been affiliated to the Calcutta University. In 1949, the college was affiliated to the Gauhati University. With the establishment of the Assam University (Central) at Silchar, in 1994 Gurucharan College is now affiliated to the Assam University. Today, the college boasts of having a student enrolment of more than 5000 in Arts, Science, Commerce stream including BBA and Higher Secondary.

The course curricula and examinations of H.S Course are conducted as per rules and regulations of Assam Higher Secondary Education Council. From the academic session 2023-2024 the college has implemented the curriculum of the NEP-2020 through the FYUG programme.

Besides these, from the academic session 2005-06, the college has come up with three UGC approved Career Oriented Programmes (value-added course) for the students conducted by the Department of Commerce. The introduction of different self-financing courses in the subject like Biotechnology, Computer Science (Pass and Honours), Diploma course in Bio-informatics, Computer Application (DCA), Library and Information Science, Bengali Recitation, Spoken Sanskrit and Manipuri Folk Dance are added chapters to the glorious history of the College. The BBA Course is yet another added feather to the crown of the college. The newly introduced Mass Communication as elective subject in UG level has opened a new area of learning for the students of the college. Over and above, the college has housed IGNOU as a Centre of distance education facilitating both UG and PG Courses.

The year 2016 is a glorious year in the history of Gurucharan College for being reaccredited as 'A' Grade with CGPA 3.11 under cycle 2 by NAAC, Bangalore. It has also been recognised as college with potential Excellence (CPE) by UGC. It is to be put on records that the college also possesses well-equipped library with its large variety of books, journals and magazines, e-journals and INFLIBNET facility. The library also has collaboration with the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India to assist in developing the Manuscript Resource Centre and National Manuscript Conservation in the library.

Gurucharan College also owns a sophisticated Central Computer lab, a magnificent auditorium, enriched Anthropological Museum, Bioinformatics Centre, Biotech Hub, two well-built hostels separately for boys and girls, and well-developed playground, two Units of NSS, NCC wings for boys and girls and so on. It has also made available well equipped gymnasium separately for boys and girls, health centre, cafeteria, separate common room for boys and girls and a printing press of its own. Keeping in mind the directives of the government, the college has taken initiative for cashless transaction. It is also one of the proud members of Digital India Campaign.

GENERAL INFORMATION

A. ADMISSION FOR H.S & FYUG

- i. Application for admission into the college should be made in prescribed Application Form through online mode only.
- ii. Notices prescribing the norms, date of counselling admission etc. are hung up in the College Notice Board.
- iii. Admission process is conducted under direct control of Admission Committee constituted for the purpose. There is separate admission committee for each faculty/stream (Arts, Science, Commerce & BBA) headed by a Convener. Each committee will determine their respective admission criteria.
- iv. The candidates have to submit separate admission forms for separate faculties.
- v. While filling up the forms for admission, an applicant should pay due attention in the matter of furnishing his/her preference for Combination he/she intends to take up.
- vi. Admission is based strictly on merit and is governed by college admission rules framed by admission committees. Convener's decision regarding admission stands final.
- vii. Any undue pressure or interference in the matter(s) of admission will be treated as disqualification amounting to forfeiture of claim for admission.
- viii. The attested copies of the following documents are to be furnished along with application for admission:

Supporting documents to prove domicile of Assam

- Mark Sheet and Certificates of H.S.L.C. and other qualifying examinations.
 - Character Certificate.
 - SC/ST/OBC/MOBC Certificate.
 - Gap certificate in case the student passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year.
 - Migration certificate for C.B.S.E. and outside State students. 1 Latest Passport size photograph for Identity card.
- ix. No request for admission will be entertained after the prescribed date fixed by the authority.

B. SOME IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS:

- i. Submission of Registration form for H.S. & FYUP students is compulsory.
- ii. Students are directed to go through the Notice Board/College Website regularly to acquire necessary information from time to time.
- iii. Guardians are requested to keep checking the local newspaper and college website for Eligibility criteria, date of admission in Higher secondary & FYUP Courses.

C. CHANGE OF SUBJECT(s)/COMBINATION

In general, change of subject(s)/combination is not encouraged. Students should give proper thought in the matter before filling in their application form for admission.

D. COLLEGE TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

Application for Transfer Certificate shall be accompanied by the following requisites:

- i) Dues clearance certificate from the College Office.
- ii) Library Clearance Certificate.
- iii) Hostel Clearance Certificate.
- iv) Records of attendance duly signed by the respective Heads of the Departments.
- v) Surrender of College Identity Card.

E. ADMISSION OF UNSUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

- i) H.S. 1st Year and 2nd Year students who appeared at the AHSE Council's examination but failed, shall appear at the subsequent First Year/Final Year Examination of the Council as non-collegiate candidates except that H.S. 2nd year Science students shall be required to attend requisite number of practical classes on getting themselves admitted as casual students.
- ii) In case of TDC Students, Guidelines of Assam University will be applicable.

F. FEE WAIVER

- i) Income Certificate should be obtained from Circle Officer (Compliant Revenue Official) only, as per ECF No. 29487/132 dated 3rd April, 2024.

F. COLLEGE EXAMINATION AND ATTENDANCE RULES

- i) Minimum 2 (two) Unit Tests will be held in FYUG & H.S. Level. Weightage will be given to examination results of Unit Tests in sending up students for Council/University Examination.
- ii) A minimum of 75% of class attendance is mandatory to appear in the Council/University examination, as a regular candidate.

G. GENERAL RULES FOR DISCIPLINE

- i. The college maintains a high standard of discipline. Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students. They are to obey traditional norms of discipline.
- ii. Students and guardians are required to furnish an undertaking at the time of admission in respect of the students' regular attendance in classes and appearance in college examinations.
- iii. The students admitted to the college must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college and hostel fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means in the examination etc. are some of the offences which may make the erring students liable for disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, non-award of college certificate, forced transfer, expulsion from the College and Hostel.
- iv. Students are to keep Photo-Identity Cards with them in the College campus. On demand, students are required to produce Photo-Identity Cards issued to them by the college authority. Failure to produce the Identity Cards may debar them from attending Classes/ College.
- v. Students may be suspended / expelled / device seized or refused admission to next session for any breach of college or hostel discipline, such as
 - Use of alcoholic beverages and hallucinatory drugs.
 - Political or communal involvement which affect the peace and harmony in the College Campus.
- vi. Use of Mobile Phone & Cell phone, ipods, MP3 players by the students within the College Campus is strictly prohibited.
- vii. Parking place should be used for parking of two-wheelers, cycles, cars etc.
- viii. While within the College Campus, students should be in college uniform with college emblem.
- ix. All forms of ragging in hostel and college-campus are strictly prohibited and will make a student liable to punitive/disciplinary action.
- x. The courses of studies in G. C. College are full time courses. No student can take any other full time courses/job anywhere simultaneously.
- xi. Students' Society and Associations shall be subjected to such rules and regulations that college administration may describe from time to time.
- xii. Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the College and Hostel premises shall require the approval of the College Authority.
- xiii. All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the Institution and his decision shall be final in all such matters.

INSTRUCTION FOR HIGHER SECONDARY COURSES (ARTS / SCIENCE / COMMERCE) ADMISSION RULES AND PROCEDURES

TWO - YEAR HIGHER SECONDARY (H.S.) COURSE :

Two - Year Higher Secondary (H.S.) Course in Arts, Science & Commerce is governed by the rules and regulations of Higher Secondary Council, Assam. The course comprises of two examinations viz. (i) First Year and (ii) Final Year. Promotion to second year or final year depends on the successful completion of first year examination conducted by the College under AHSEC guidelines.

Eligibility for Admission to First Year H.S. Course :

For seeking admission to the first year Higher Secondary Course, a candidate must have passed H.S.L.C. Examination of SEBA, Guwahati or Secondary Examination of CBSE or Other Board Examination recognised by the AHSEC.

Admission in H.S. course of any stream will be given as per the specified percentage of marks prescribed by the respective Admission Committee.

Note : In case of Gap year, 2% marks per year will be deducted from the original percentage obtained by a candidate in HSLC.

Number of Seats in First Year of H.S. Course :

The total number of seats earmarked for the session 2024-2025 in different streams are as follows :

(i) Arts	:	Morning = 120	Day = 250
(ii) Science	:	Morning = 75	Day = 125
(iii) Commerce	:	Morning = 80	Day = 120

Reservation :

- There is provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to ST, SC etc. as per Govt. Rules.
- A few seats are reserved for Children of G.C. College Employees.

- Regarding combination, decision of the Admission Committee is final and binding.

Registration under Assam Higher Secondary Education Council is compulsory. Date of applying for the same will be notified in the college notice board after admission.

Change of Subject(s) / Combination

In general, change of subject(s)/combination is not encouraged. Students should exercise proper discretion in the matter before filling in their application form for admission.

Unit Tests (compulsory) will be held within:

1st test September/October &

2nd test January/February

Each test of 25 marks, qualifying marks is 30%. If any candidate fails to appear in the tests or obtain qualifying marks then only one special test may be arranged before the submission of application forms and fees for the examination.

Eligibility criteria for admission in examination:

- i) One should have 75% of attendance both in the theory and practical papers. 65% attendance may be considered only on special ground as justified and certified by the Principal.
- ii) One should have to qualify in the unit tests securing at least 30% of marks.

INSTRUCTION FOR FOUR YEAR UNDER GRADUATE (FYUG) PROGRAMME (under NEP 2020)

Primary Guidelines for implementation of NEP 2020 for UG courses of colleges affiliated to Assam University, Silchar.

1. UG curriculum for colleges affiliated to Assam University shall be a four-year UG programme (FYUG) as per curriculum structure provided in Annexure-1. Option for lateral exit shall be free from additional 04 credit earning. In lieu of Project/ Dissertation in VIII semester, students shall have option to take three additional courses as Discipline Specific Course which will be equal to 12 credits in total. However, students opting for project/dissertation will be given Honours with Research degree and students opting for additional three Discipline Specific courses in lieu of Project/Dissertation will be given Honours degree. It is also resolved that all those three papers (DSC-452,453 and 454) should be of level 500. FYUG is structured with options for lateral Exit and Entry at various levels :

Certificate, Diploma, Bachelor's Degree or Bachelor's Degree with Honours to be provided at the end of each year of exit under FYUG

	Exit Options
1.	Certificate : Upon the Successful Completion of the 1 st Year (2 nd Semester)
2.	Diploma : Upon the Successful Completion of the 2 nd Year (4 th Semester)
3.	Bachelor's Degree : Upon the Successful Completion of the 3 rd Year (6 th Semester)
4.	Bachelor's Degree with Honours and/or Research : In a discipline / subject, upon the Successful Completion of the 4 th Year (8 th Semester)

2. Offering Four Year Under Graduate (FYUG) programme is mandatory for all affiliated colleges. However, the colleges Departments shall have liberty if Honours with Research be offered or not depending upon their infrastructural limitation.
FYUG comprises the following Courses:
DSC – Discipline Specific Core
DSM - Discipline Specific Minor
 (For each subject, DSM is of two kinds, viz., First Minor & Second Minor)
IDC – Interdisciplinary Course
AEC – Ability Enhancement Course [Alternative English or MIL (Languages)]
SEC – Skill Enhancement Course
VAC – Value Added Course
3. Interdisciplinary courses shall have 04 baskets viz: Natural Sciences (NS), Social Sciences (SS), Humanities (HN) and Commerce & Management (CM). Students may opt for any one from those 04 baskets in each of I, II and III semesters.
 Bunching of subjects in each basket shall be as per Annexure-II.
4. From Discipline Specific Minor students shall take two subjects related to his/her Discipline. Each such subject should be 50% of total credit allotted to this course Viz: for Three Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 13 credits and for Four Year UG programme each Discipline Specific Minor shall be of 17 credits. Assam University shall notify cluster of subjects from which Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) can be chosen. To be more precise it is decided that DSM- 101(3). DSM-201 (4). DSM -251(3) and DSM-301(3) = 13 credits should be the first minor subjects in case of Three Year UG Programme (TYUG) and DSM-151 (3) DSM -252 (3). DSM-DSM-302 (3) and DSM-351(4)-13 should be second minor subject. For FYUG Programme DSM 401 (4) should be first minor subject and DSM -451(4) should be second minor subject.

5. Students securing highest CGPA (above 6.0) and with no back paper shall be allowed to change his/her core course once only after completion of second semester. However, if a candidate desires to make one of his/her minors to core then automatic change in the minor should be done as same subject cannot be opted as both core and minor. Also change of core may be allowed only within allied subjects.
6. **7.5 CGPA should be obtained by a student up to 3rd year for opting Honours with Research Degree in 4 year. However, for only Honours degree there shall not be any CGPA restriction. But students with arrear paper shall not be allowed to move to 4th year in any case.**
7. Evaluation of 3 and 4 credit courses shall be out of 100 marks and that for 2 credit courses shall be out of 50 marks
8. IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.
9. For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.
10. SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM. Evaluation method for SEC for Science stream shall be 50 (End Semester Theory) +30 (End Sem Practical/Project/Field work) + 20 (internal test of which 14 for test and 6 for attendance). The same for Arts and commerce shall be 50 (End Semester Theory) +20 (End Semester Practical Project Field work) + 30 (internal test of which 20 for test and 10 for attendance).
11. For EVS (VAC-151) evaluation method shall be 70 (End Semester exam) + 30 Internal Assignment. Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
12. Evaluation method for VAC-101 (with practical) shall be same as that of SEC (with practical) and that of VAC-101 (Without practical) shall be same as VAC-151.
13. EVS in VAC-151 should be of 100 level and EVS included in Natural Science Basket as IDC should be of 200 level.
14. Publication/Presentation of papers out of Research Project/ Dissertation carried out in VIII semester is not mandatory. However, the project shall have to be presented before Departmental Research Committee and in presence of an external examiner during end semester examination. Total marks for the project shall be 300 of which 90 shall be internal and 210 is for end semester examination. In case of Dissertation Project, out of 90 marks as internal, there shall be three progress reviews and each review shall be of 30 marks. Marks obtained by a student in each of the review shall be notified immediately. Review of progress shall be done by concerned supervisor in presence of Departmental Research Committee.
15. For all other courses evaluation method shall be of 70 marks (for End Semester Examination) and 30 marks (for Internal Examination), Marks for Internal test shall again be divided to 20 for written test and 10 for attendance.
16. Student opting Natural Science as IDC shall not have any practical component.
17. For Subjects with practical DSC -152. DSC -253. DSC-303. DSC-354 and DSC- 404 shall be practical with 100 marks. Practical examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
18. For Subjects with practical DSM -251 shall be practical for first minor and DSM-351 shall be practical for second minor. Marks for practical examination shall be 100 each and examination shall be held in presence of External Examiner.
19. For VAC 151 (EVS), shall not have any practical component.
20. **For opting DSC and DSM combination, clustering of subjects shall be as per ANNEXURE-III. DSC from one cluster and DSM from other cluster is not allowed. DSC, DSM and IDC cannot be the same subject.**

21. All DSM courses shall be stand-alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice keeping total requirement of 17 credit for each minor but they cannot change the code of minor papers, viz: One student of Physics (Core) may have Chemistry as first minor in DSM 101 and Mathematics as second minor in DSM 151. But the other student of Physics (core) may have Mathematics as first minor in DSM-101 and Chemistry as second minor in DSM 151.
22. For *Research with Honours* students. DSC-451 paper shall be research methodology and content of this course shall be same across the subjects and across the disciplines. However, for other students. DSC 451 will be a usual 500 level paper.
23. **Any student interested to opt for Honours with Research should have 7.5 CGPA upto third year without any arrears.**
24. In lieu of MIL, Alternative English may be opted by a student

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The college has two NSS units comprising of 100 volunteers per unit. The motto of NSS is 'Not me but you'. The NSS units of the college are very vibrant in doing works in the social sectors and extend community service.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Gurucharan College, Silchar, was established on Oct, 2005. The primary goal of IQAC is to develop a quality system for conscious, consistent & catalytic programmed action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the college. The IQAC ensures continuous improvement in the entire operations of the institution and ensures the Institution's accountability to the stakeholders.

For enrichment of academic and extra-academic activities of the college, IQAC has established three centres namely GCC-Infoline, Eco Club and Central Instrumentation Centre (CIC). They will act as repositories for information and cater to the needs for inter-disciplinary education and research. Recently, IQAC G.C. College has received financial grant of ₹. 3 Lakh from UGC for its upgradation.

ECO-CLUB

The Eco-Club was formed in the session 2011-12 with the objective to address to the issues related to environment and its allied subjects.

G.C. COLLEGE WOMEN'S CELL

For the protection of the women staff and female students against any kind of harassment in the working place, G.C. College has established a Women Cell. This cell has been named KIRON SASHI WOMEN'S CELL in memory of Late Kiron Sashi Naug whose donation gave birth to this premier institution in the name of her husband, Late Gurucharan Naug.

The motto of this Women's Cell is to offer all sorts of redressal of grievances of women - both teachers & students, in this co-educational institution, in addition to generating interest in women folks of this College for participation in different Social Welfare Schemes. All Women Teachers are the members of this Women's Cell. Two female students are also offered membership of this Women's Cell.

RED RIBBON CLUB

As a service to the nation Red Ribbon Club organises Blood donation Camp in the college. In September 2015, 265 donors (students, ex-students, NCC cadets, teachers and others) donated blood which is considered to be the highest by an educational institution in this region.

It also arranges special AIDS awareness programme through open-air drama in various places to enlighten the locality regarding the various precautionary measures to be taken for preventing AIDS.

EXTENSION SERVICE CELL

The Extension Service Cell runs a coaching centre in slum area. It provides study materials like copy, pencil, rubber, pencil box, umbrella, school bag to the students. Yoga classes are also carried out among the students.

In January, 2016 at the Itkhola ghat slum area a free eye camp was organised and 478 patients were examined and free medicines were provided. Free cataract operations to 20 patients identified in the camp were done through Ramakrishna Mission Sevashrama, Silchar. 60 patients were provided free spectacles after proper examination.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

To take care of all kinds of grievances of the students regarding academic and cocurricular activities the college has a Grievance Redressal Cell to address the same.

COLLEGE MAJLIS

G.C. College Students' Union is popularly known as MAJLIS. It has its own constitution. The Principal of the College is its ex-officio President. The office bearers of the MAJLIS are directly elected by the students through election every year. The MAJLIS election is held usually in the last week of September. The MAJLIS organizes various co-curricular activities from time to time and during 'Annual Social Week' of the College. In addition, the MAJLIS organizes Freshers' Welcome, Sharad Utsav, Milad, Saraswati Puja etc., and other important events.

COLLEGE ENVIRONMENT CELL

College Environment Cell under Assam Science Technology and Environment Council (ASTEC) was established at Gurucharan College, Silchar from the Session 2018-2019. It works mainly for environment education, clean environment and Biodiversity conservation.

CENTRE FOR INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM

Indian Knowledge System (IKS) is an innovative cell under the Union Ministry of Education (MoE). "It is established to promote interdisciplinary research on all aspects of IKS and preserve and disseminate IKS for further research and societal applications." It will actively engage in spreading the rich heritage of our country and traditional knowledge in the field of Arts and literature, Agriculture, Basic Sciences, Engineering & Technology, Architecture, Management, Economics, etc.

MENTAL HEALTH CELL

The Mental Health Centre is an institute to improve mental well-being by providing effective guidance to the students, escalation comprehensive, integrated and responsive community-based care, implementing promotion and prevention strategies, and strengthening information systems so that students can strengthen their emotional, psychological and social well-being.

G.C.COLLEGE INCUBATION CENTRE

The G.C.College Incubation Centre, formed by the Department of Commerce of the College, will educate and nurture the prospective entrepreneurs of the region. Formed for the first time in Barak Valley, the Incubation Centre 'will provide the start-ups with necessary guidance, technological support, infrastructure and workspace, access to investors, networking and facilitating lot of other resources required for the start-ups to survive and develop. It will develop a bond between the academic and industry that generates entrepreneurial ideas and incubate research bent of mind among students so that they can be made self reliant and contribute to the nation building.

B) **Reference Section:** Here, the rare and valuable collection is kept as reference source. Nearly 4000 volumes of valuable books are there for use by various categories of users like renowned personalities, resource persons, research scholars and university and college students. Persons not only from various parts of Barak Valley visit this library, but also from various parts of Brahmaputra Valley, North East India, Kolkata, New Delhi, Bangalore, etc. come to visit this library in search of information.

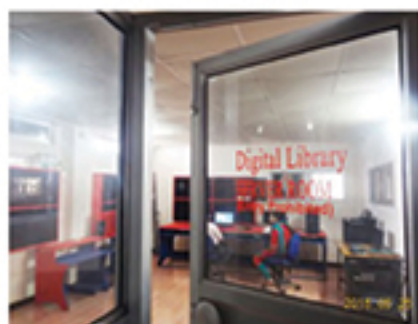

C) Manuscript Section : This is a new feather to the college library which was developed during 2004-05. In 1995, the Manuscript Section was designated as Manuscript Resource Centre (MRC) by the National Mission for Manuscript (Now under IGNCA), Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India. This MRC covers 12 districts of Assam for manuscripts survey, documentation and preservation. In 2010, a Manuscript Conservation Centre (MCC) was also established in collaboration with the same Ministry of which activities are already started.

D) Periodical Section : This section contains almost 36 periodicals ranging from research level, career opportunities and popular magazine.

E) Newspaper Section: This section houses 7 nos. of newspaper.

F) Digital Library Section: The Library is having a digital library with techfocuz digital Library Software.

G) UGC-Network Resource Centre: Under this centre, coordination of various activities, programmes, schemes, notices, etc, sponsored by UGC are looked after besides providing Internet services to teachers and students.

H) EDUSAT National Network Centre: The EDUSAT National Network Centre, which has been developed in collaboration with the Consortium of Educational Communication, New Delhi, is presently active in the College library, through which national educational programmes telecast by CEC, UGC, ISRO, IGNOU are available not only for viewing but one can also participate in the discussions live through phone or by web camera.

I) UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium: The College library has been selected for the UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium, a programme which is sponsored by the UGC under INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad. Though activities are pending yet, when it will get activated, library users will be able to browse and download approximately 4600 periodicals, national and international, in the library. The G.C. College library is amongst other 50 colleges of all over India to get selected for such programme.

J) N-LIST Programme: The College is now having the latest INFLIBNET Programme called National Library & information Service of Scholarly Content (N-LIST) through which more than 6100 e-journals (including current issues with 5-10 years back files) and more than 97,000 + e-books are accessible for any user using login ID and Password. Students are allowed to use this facility from the Central Library.

k) N.E. Block: This Section is having Micro Literature of North - Eastern Regions.



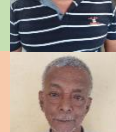

SWEATER	: Coffee colour, plain, front closed 'V' neck. Sleeveless or Full sleeves.



Dress Code for Girls :

SAREE	: Coffee colour
BLOUSE	: Sandal colour, round neck, half sleeve with college logo on the right sleeve.
KAMEEZ	: Sandal colour, close round neck, full sleeves or half sleeves with college logo to be stitched on the left sleeve above the elbow level, knee length with 10 to 12 inches side cut (Bottom)
CHUNNI	: Coffee colour V – Shape with 6 inch pleats.
SALWAR	: Coffee colour
SHOES	: Black Foot – wear with maximum elevation – 2 inches.
SOCKS	: Coffee colour (Optional).
SWEATER	: Coffee colour, front open 'V' neck, sleeveless or full sleeves.
